Purpose of Event

The purpose of the event was to have open and inclusive conversations on issues surrounding education for the local community.

This event was part of a pilot study project supported by the European Commission in collaboration with the Teaching Council, the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), and a range of education stakeholders in Ireland.

The project as a whole aims to uncover ways in which local school community engagement can contribute meaningfully to national education policy development in Ireland.

The project team has partnered with the Burren College of Art (BCA) and the Centre for Effective Services (CES) to facilitate and evaluate the events.

The event was supported by Kerry Education and Training Board who co-ordinated involvement of local school communities.

Culture Clubs in schools representing all cultures to increase awareness and understanding

What is working well?

So many more supports than in the past.

The possibility of being yourself in a safe environment.

Many students from diverse backgrounds

More awareness of multicultural education, and the needs of others. But still a long way to go!

Special classes where teachers can help you with homework

What is working well?

Teachers seem to really care about the whole child

Positive school culture, positive relationships

Teachers finding time to talk with students

Being able to foster a caring relationship with students as opposed to academic focus

What could work better?

Having teachers to go to if you're struggling with mental health and knowing they care and will help

Alternative for PE to include all students

More Creative Options – outdoor creative options

Young relatable 'counsellor' type people available to talk to

What messages do we most want to send to those in charge of Education in Ireland?

More funding needs to be available to deal with our mental health crisis.

Senior cycle needs to be more about new ways of learning and less on rote learning

More teamwork so classmates can communicate more and no one will feel excluded or left out

Total reform is needed from primary to college/university in order to unlock everyone's potential

What messages do we most want to send to those in charge of Education in Ireland? (contd.)

We need to have conversations in school, at home, at government level about what we value and why.

Traveller Culture needs to be included in the curriculum

Not all pressure on one final exam, need to change to relieve pressure on students

If there was one thing you could change in the Irish Education System, what would it be?

School should be more enjoyable and less stressful

The amount of subjects – should be changed to cross curricular style subjects

Disabilities such as dyslexia should not be exempt

More time for informal learning to explore contemporary trends emerging in local areas/communities
